Iceland's breathtaking landscape is an inspiration to artists and photographers. It is the least densely populated country in Europe, with a pure, unpolluted and truly magical landscape. Iceland's summers are surprisingly warm, lush and green, with days lengthening until midsummer, when the sun dips down to the horizon but never sets. During winter you can marvel at the amazing, undulating green, blue, yellow and pink lights of the aurora in the night sky, and the winters are not as cold as you might imagine. It is an island of contrasts, where heaven and earth meet, where the Sagas of the Vikings were written. It is a land of glaciers, erupting volcanoes and the magnificent midnight sun.

Iceland was the last European country to be settled, mostly by Norsemen in the 9th and 10th centuries. They came mainly from Norway and elsewhere in Scandinavia, and from the Norse settlements in the British Isles, from where a Celtic element was also introduced. The language and culture of Iceland were predominantly Scandinavian from the outset, but there are traces of Celtic influence in some of the ancient poetry, in some

personal names and in the appearance of present-day Icelanders.

Iceland today is a progressive modern European society with a high standard of living and a high level of technology and education. 'Iceland, as the late Victor Borge used to say, is a little, big country...a very large island with a very small population, just over a quarter of a million people...but it has never been an insignificant, or an isolated, or a primitive place'.

## Registration
