

Progress and Exclusion from courses

For the purposes of all courses offered by the Faculty, unless the Faculty determines otherwise on the basis of written or other evidence placed before it, a student shall be excluded from further enrolment if the student is deemed by the Faculty to have made unsatisfactory progress towards completion of the course.

Unsatisfactory progress shall be deemed to be:

- for Bachelor courses failure in 24 credit points;
- for Diploma and Graduate Certificate courses failure in 12 credit points;
- for Graduate Diploma and Master courses failure in 18 credit points.
- for Master courses an unsatisfactory report by the supervisor of a master candidate in the research units.

Candidates may be excluded from the course for up to three years.

At the end of the period of exclusion the student may apply for readmission to the course.

The Faculty may impose conditions on the enrolment of any candidate whose progress is deemed to be unsatisfactory or on any student who has been admitted to candidature after having a record of failure in units in another faculty or at another institution.

Progress and Exclusion from units

Unless the Faculty determines otherwise on the basis of written or other evidence placed before it, a student who has failed to achieve a passing grade in a particular unit after two attempts shall be excluded from re-enrolment in that unit.

Candidates may be excluded from enrolment in a unit for up to three years.

At the end of the period of exclusion the student may again apply to be enrolled in the unit.

The Faculty may impose conditions on the enrolment of any candidate whose progress is deemed to be unsatisfactory or on any student who has been admitted to candidature after having a record of failure in units in another faculty or at another institution.
