## Guidelines for the Bachelor of Arts component

96 credit points (cp) from subjects and areas of study listed for the BA;

- not more than 36 cp at 100 level;
- at least 48 cp, including at least 18 at 300 level, in a single subject; and
- at least 12 cp in each of three separate subjects.

## Guidelines for the Bachelor of Business component

96 cp from:

a) The following ten compulsory units to the value of 60 cp: AFM 101, 112, COMP 100, ECON 101, ECON 102, ECON 243, MM 105\*, MM 110, MM 200 and QM 161;

b) 36 cp from one of the majors below provided that any unit included shall count only towards the Business component of the combined degree.

\*students who undertake PSYC 101 in their Arts component select an alternative unit from units below in place of MM105.

A Business Major is one of the following:

- Agribusiness:** ECON 121, 223, 203/303 or 230/330; plus three units from: ECON 333, 334, 335, 336.
- Business Economics:** QM 262; ECON 201, 202; plus three units from ECON 303, 305, 307, 311, 317, 319, 328, 329.
- Decision Support Tools for Business:** QM 262, 265/365, 267/367 plus three units from ECON 271/371, 326, 334, 375, 376, 377, MATH 170, MM 205/305, QM 264/364. Note three units must be 300 level.
- Financial Management:** AFM 202, 231, 232, 272, 312, 316, 322, 324, 331, 332, 334, 372; EBUS 201; ECON 203/303, 319. Note: At least two units must be at 300 level.
- Human Resource Management:** MM 205/305, 220, 321; ECON 251/351 plus two units from MM 223/323, 300, 320, 322; ECON 207; THEA 110; WGST 320. Note: three units must be at 300 level.
- International Business:** ECON 142, 245/345; MM 202/302; Plus three units from: AFM 335, ECON 241, 245/345, 246/346, 248/348, 249/349, 250/350. 320, 335, 354, 353 LS 393; MM 318. Any 6 cp language unit at 200/300 level. Note: three units must be at 300 level.
- Marketing:** MM 213/313, 214/314, 311, Plus three units from EBUS 302, MM 205/305, 300, 316; THEA 110. Note: three units must be at 300 level.
