- 144 credit points.
- both units in Group I are compulsory but not undertaken until pre-requisites are met.
- at least 12 credit points in Psychology and Sociology (and a 48 cps major in one of them).
- not more than 60 credit points at 100 level.
- not more than 18 credit points at 100 level in any one subject.
- at least 48 credit points and no more than 84 cps in a Group IIA subject with 12 cps at 300 level. It is possible to do a sequence of units to 300-level in both Psychology and Sociology.
- not more than 48 cps from a subject in Group IIB.
- up to 30 credit points from Group III can be included, no more than 12 credit points can be at 100-level.

Advanced Standing Rule

- If you have advanced standing in Psychology or Sociology, you must undertake at least 36 cps at 200/300 level **AT UNE** in either Psychology or Sociology, with at least 12 cps of these at 300 level.
