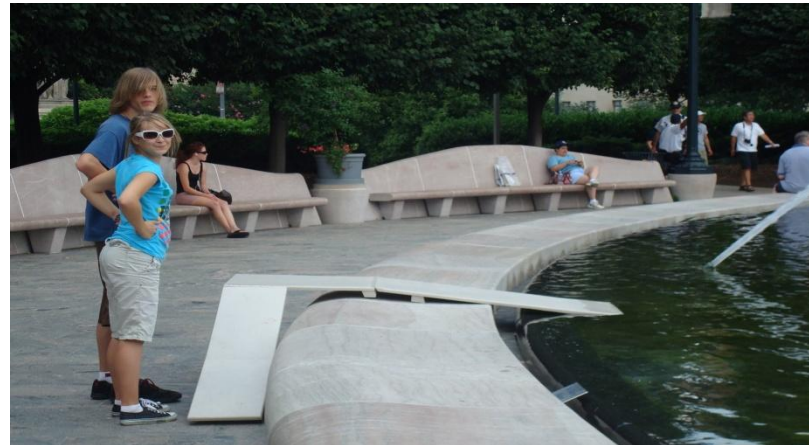

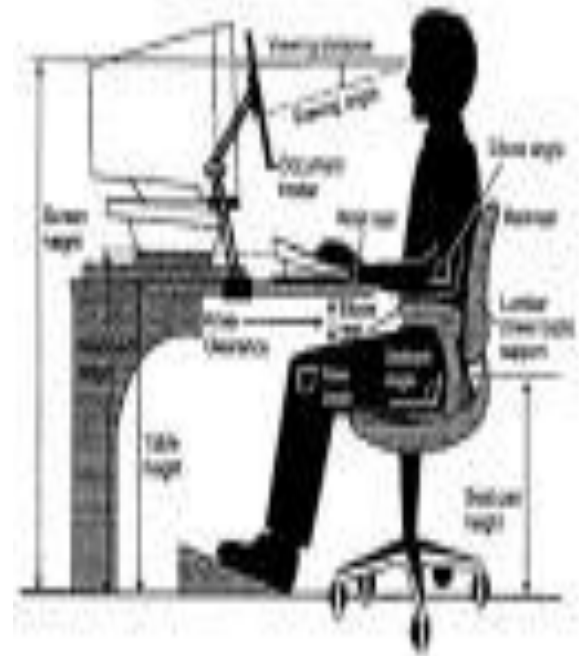

Risk assessment

1. Identify risk
2. Identify likelihood or exposure
- 3 Identify consequences or outcome
- 4 Use Knowrisk matrix to calculate

Knowrisk Matrix (OHS Form 4.23a)

INSIGNIFICANT	1	2	3	4	5
MINOR	2	4	6	8	10
MODERATE	3	6	9	12	15
MAJOR	4	8	12	16	20
CATASTROPHIC	5	10	15	20	25
