## TEMPORARY MOBILITY PARKING POLICY

### 1. Temporary Mobility Parking

With the introduction of the UNE Traffic and Parking Policy the University is able for the first time to assist staff and students with temporary mobility problems who are not eligible for assistance under the RTA Mobility Parking Scheme, with access to reserved parking where available.

### 2. Applications

Staff and students who are registered Parking Permit holders who through illness/injury or medical condition may apply to the Injury Management Coordinator, Personnel Services for a Temporary Mobility Parking Permit. Persons who do not meet the criteria for a Temporary Parking Permit may make application to the Safety and Security Manager for special consideration.

### 3. Reserved Parking Areas

The Temporary Mobility Permit will allow permit holders to park in bays reserved for UNE Vehicles where available; there are currently 52 spaces available on the Academic Campus and 25 in the Residential College Precinct.

### 4. Criteria

- Applicants must be current holders of a UNE Parking Permit.
- They must produce a current Medical Certificate.
- They must make application to the Injury Management Coordinator.
- Permits are issued by the Injury Management Coordinator.
- Permits are issued for a maximum period of 1 month then reviewed.
- Application can be made to the Safety and Security Manager for special consideration.
- Permits are subject to enforcement.
