Selection Criteria – SENIOR LECTURER

Essential Criteria

1. A PhD in a discipline relevant to Parasitology or Evolutionary Biology.
2. An excellent research record, including articles in high-impact peer-reviewed journals, or other professional and research outputs.
3. Demonstrated capacity to contribute to the research profile of UNE by gaining competitive research grants, and leading substantial collaborative projects
4. Evidence of ability to attract and supervise Honours and higher degree research students
5. Experience in teaching into and coordinating undergraduate or postgraduate coursework units in relevant aspects of zoology and/or rural science.
6. Demonstrated ability to communicate effectively and cooperate with colleagues across disciplines in teaching and research, and to provide academic leadership on specific issues.
7. Willingness to engage in the academic administration within the School and University.
8. Commitment to EEO and OHS principles as a teacher and researcher.

Desirable Criteria

1. Familiarity with distance education, including teaching online.
2. Willingness to contribute to teaching and research in appropriate areas elsewhere in the School.
3. Experience with handling animals and gaining appropriate scientific permits and ethics approvals.
4. Experience in international collaborations and developing multi-institutional collaborations.

6. Demonstrated ability to communicate effectively and cooperate with colleagues across disciplines in teaching and research.
7. Willingness to provide support to the academic administration within the School.
8. Commitment to EEO and OHS principles as a teacher and researcher.
