

UNIVERSITY OF NEW ENGLAND
Inverell Rotary Scholarship
Terms and Conditions

1. Introduction

The University of New England has established undergraduate scholarships to support country students who have a record of academic achievement, and have been involved in leadership positions in school and the community. Some scholarships are funded by donations or grants from individuals or organisations and may include specific criteria beyond the usual University requirements.

The recipient will be a full-time, on-campus student at the University of New England in a Bachelor of Agricultural Economics, Bachelor of Natural Resources, Bachelor of Rural Science, Bachelor of Agriculture or Bachelor of Agribusiness degree.

2. Details

3. Eligibility

- The applicant must be an Australian citizen or permanent resident as defined by the Commonwealth (refer to www.goingtouni.gov.au) who has applied, via UAC or QTAC, for admission to a Bachelor of Agricultural Economics, Bachelor of Natural Resources, Bachelor of Rural Science, Bachelor of Agriculture or Bachelor of Agribusiness degree.
- The applicant's residential address must be within the Inverell Shire Council area.

4. Selection

- The scholarship will be awarded on the basis of academic merit as indicated by recent academic records or the applicant's performance in the NSW HSC, or equivalent.

5. Report/s

Number required: 1 (one) – School Principal's Report

6. Closing Date

Last Friday in September

7. Other Conditions

- The scholarship shall be administered by and made on the recommendation of the Undergraduate Scholarships Committee.
- There will be no commitment by the University to employ the recipient.

- The scholarship is intended for the nominated undergraduate degree and may not be deferred or transferred without the written approval of the Chair of the Undergraduate Scholarships Committee.
- The scholarship is payable directly into the recipient's bank account in two instalments after each census date (mid-April and mid-August).
- Continuation of the scholarship is subject to satisfactory academic progress:
 - The scholarship shall comprise a cash payment of five hundred dollars (\$500) annually for the duration of the course, conditional upon the recipient maintaining at least a Pass average or equivalent GPA.
 - It is expected that the recipient will be enrolled full-time and complete the course in the minimum period of candidature applicable to the course.
- Undergraduate scholarship holders may not hold more than one UNE scholarship if the combined value is greater than three thousand five hundred dollars (\$3,500) per annum.
- Recipients will be required to submit brief reports (by 30th June and 30th November each year) on their progress with their studies and involvement in sporting, cultural and community activities as well as participation in University life.
- Additional conditions may apply to some scholarships and may vary by scholarship (e.g. specific conditions on eligibility, voluntary work requirements and payment schedules). When offers are made for these scholarships, the recipient will be made aware of specific conditions that apply.
- Any request to vary the conditions of the scholarship must be made in writing and will be determined at the discretion of the Undergraduate Scholarships Committee.
- The recipient will be required to attend the annual scholarships presentation evening, if they are invited to do so, and may be asked to participate in activities to promote this scholarship, including public speaking, donor liaison, media interviews and photographs.

8. Acceptance of Conditions

- In accepting the Inverell Rotary Scholarship the recipient acknowledges that he/she is accepting the terms and conditions outlined above.
- Failure to meet the requirements of these terms and conditions may lead to the termination of the scholarship.
