# DEFERRED EXAMINATION

## Information for Applicants

### What is a Deferred Examination?

If you are unable to sit your exam or if your performance in the exam was severely affected due to unforeseen circumstances beyond your control, you may be eligible for a Deferred Examination. A Deferred Examination is a chance to re-sit the exam, which is normally held in the next formal examination period. Your application is subject to approval, so it is always best that you attend your exam if you are able.

- **Misreading (or not reading) your exam timetable is not grounds for a Deferred Exam**
- **Sitting consecutive examinations is not a sufficient reason for a Deferred Exam**
- **You may only apply for either Deferred Examination OR Special Consideration per exam**

If a Deferred Exam has been approved for a previous trimester, it is not possible to apply to defer this exam further. If you are unable to sit your Deferred Exam you should apply through [AskUNE](#) for a Withdrawal Without Academic Penalty and supply further supporting documentation. This is subject to approval.

### What supporting evidence will I need?

All applications must include written supporting documentary evidence provided by an external source, and a personal statement explaining your situation. These must be submitted with your application **or it will not be considered**.

#### Medical certificates must include the following:

- The date you consulted your doctor
- The state or extent of your medical condition
- The period covered by your medical certificate
- The medical certificate must cover the date(s) of the exam(s)

We do not require specific information on the nature of your medical condition.

#### Other types of supporting evidence include:

- A supporting letter from a relevant health professional, a minister of religion, a solicitor, a Head of College (not a college tutor), the Oorala Centre, Police Report, employer, etc
- A statement from the NRMA, RACV, RACQ etc
- In exceptional circumstances UNE will accept a formal Statutory Declaration signed by a Justice of the Peace

### When must I apply – is there an Application Deadline?

Applications must be received no later than five working days after your final exam. Late applications will only be considered in exceptional circumstances and must include a satisfactory explanation for the late submission.

**Applications may be rejected purely because they are late so it is important to get your application in on time.**

### Where do I submit my application?

Via [AskUNE](#), is the preferred method for submitting your application, please be sure to attach your supporting documentation and personal statement.

### How will I know the outcome of my application?

You will be notified via your UNE email of the provisional outcome of your application. If approved, your grade when released will display as 'SPE' (Deferred exam arranged by Exams & Results) or 'SPS' (Deferred exam arranged by the School). Deferred Exams that are arranged by Exams & Results (SPE) will be held in the next formal exam period.

### When will I sit a Deferred Examination?

Deferred exams are usually held during the next formal exam period (except for SPS). You will be notified of the scheduled date and time for your Deferred Exam via your Exam Timetable for the following trimester's exam period.

- Deferred exams for T1 units are held in the T2 exam period in September/October
- Deferred exams for T2 units are held in the T3 exam period January/February the following year
- Deferred exams for T3 units are held in the following T1 exam period in May/June
