INFORMATION LAW 452D

2000

Information law is an area of law in which attempts are being made to cope with rapidly changing conditions in our society. This course looks at these changes

(including the implications of new technology for information transfer in our society), and examining in depth the responses made by different jurisdictions to these changes. We also examine recent developments in traditional areas of law such as criminal, intellectual property, appropriation of personality, contract, professional liability, access and privacy, and international for a, which have grappled with information issues. Finally, we look at attempts to create systematic national and international policies in these areas and discuss future possibilities.
