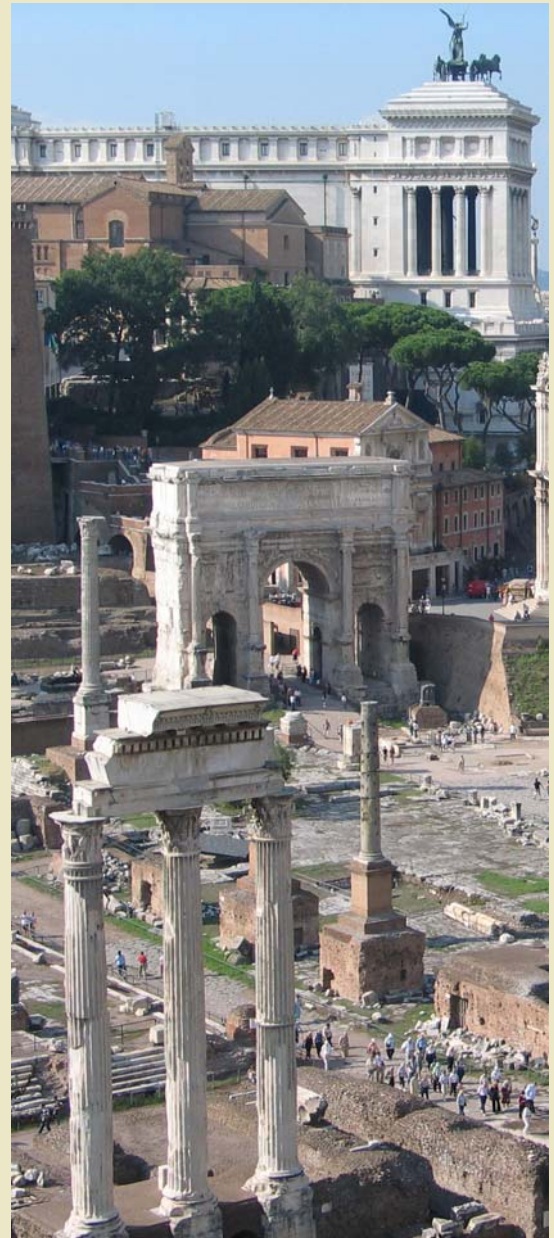
This *Classical Rome Summer School* is designed for those who wish to study the city and society, monuments, art, and literature of Ancient Rome. The tour leaders have extensive experience teaching courses on Rome and have travelled to Rome many times. They will help you to understand and appreciate the centre of an empire that extended from the Black Sea to the Pillars of Hercules and which according to their ideology had no boundaries in time or space. The *Classical Rome Summer School* can be taken on its own, combined with the optional *Shadow of Vesuvius Tour*, or with your own travel plans. It includes accommodation in Rome, air and land travel, specified site entrances and meals.

We have designed enrolment options to ensure maximum flexibility. You may enrol as an undergraduate, a postgraduate or as an auditing participant who does not have to complete any assessment. Please contact the relevant lecturer (Dr Kathryn Welch for the University of Sydney, Dr Bronwyn Hopwood for the University of New England) to enquire about the formal enrolment process.

However the tour is not restricted to students studying towards a degree. Anyone with a strong interest in the city of Rome, who wishes to travel with like-minded people and learn from acknowledged experts in the field, is encouraged to join. The tour fee includes teaching fees for the Summer School program.

Dr Bronwyn Hopwood is a lecturer in Roman History in the School of Classics, History and Religion, at the University of New England. Her specialties include the Political and Social History of the Roman Republic and Early Empire, Roman Law, Women, Iconography, and Space in Ancient Rome. Bronwyn led the 2006 tour, *Rome and the cities in the shadow of Vesuvius* jointly offered by Academy Travel and the University of New England.



Dr Kathryn Welch is a senior lecturer in Roman History in the Department of Classics and Ancient History at the University of Sydney. She has written extensively on the Roman Republic, civil war and early Imperial Rome and on Roman topographical subjects. She has taught units similar to this Summer School in Rome in 2001, 2003 and 2005.

DETAILED ITINERARY

All breakfasts included. Included lunches and dinners are indicated by the letters (L) and (D).

SUNDAY 6TH JANUARY

Your flight on *Thai Airways* departs from Sydney at 5.00pm. Departures from Melbourne and Brisbane can also be arranged on request.

MONDAY 7TH JANUARY

The tour leaders will meet you on your arrival in Rome and accompany you to your hotel where you can check in when rooms become available (in Italy this is usually about lunchtime). To help you fight any jetlag, we will take you on a very leisurely **Orientation Walk**. We will take time to introduce you to some historical sites (the Janiculum and Aventine hills) and some practical ones (internet, laundry, ATMs, transport, supermarket, shops) in Trastevere where we are staying. In the evening we will take you for an early dinner before you turn in for an early night. (D)

TUESDAY 8TH JANUARY

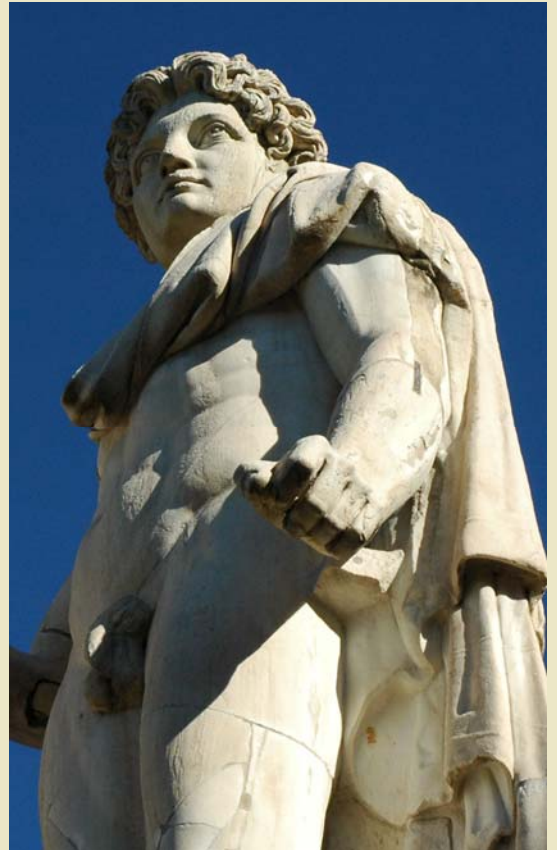
Today we visit by coach Rome's famous models and casts museum the **Museo della Civiltà Romana**, before making our way to the **Villa Giulia**, the premier museum in Italy for Etruscan culture, located in the north of the Borghese Gardens. After lunch we will travel to the **Museo Montemartini**. The Montemartini, a branch of the Capitoline Museums, houses some Republican and Augustan material arranged within the impressive remains of twentieth century industrial archaeology. We return to our hotel for the first of the evening lectures (*The Development and Triumph of Rome*), followed by time to freshen-up before making our way to a local restaurant for a 'Welcome to Rome' Dinner. (B, D)

WEDNESDAY 9TH JANUARY

We begin the day with a walking tour of the route of the ancient **Triumph** from the *Largo Argentina* to the *Forum Romanum*. After time for lunch on the Capitol we will explore the impressive collections of the **Capitoline Museums**. This evening there will be a talk on *Living Life in the Public Gaze*. (B)

THURSDAY 10TH JANUARY

Today's theme of public life and public space will see us visit the **Imperial Fora** of Caesar, Augustus, and Trajan. From here we will walk to the **Pantheon** and **Piazza Navona** where we can gaze at the Baroque palaces and four rivers of Bernini's famous fountain, laid out on top of the ruins of **Domitian's Stadium**. After lunch we will take in

the **Mausoleum** and **Ara Pacis** of Augustus before visiting the collection of antiquities in the **Palazzo Altemps**. There will be an evening talk on *Roman Houses and Public Life*. (B)

FRIDAY 11TH JANUARY

Our sightseeing today starts on the **Palatine Hill** the most salubrious address in Republican and Imperial Rome. We begin our tour with the gardens and Houses of Livia and Augustus, before taking in the Palace of Domitian and Palatine Museum. From the Palatine we then make our way to the **Antiquarium** in the Roman Forum. After lunch we will take a leisurely stroll through the **Subura**, the original high-density living area of Classical Rome. On returning to the hotel a talk will be given on *Ostia Antica: a Roman Town*. (B)

SATURDAY 12TH JANUARY

After breakfast we take a coach to the ancient port town of **Ostia Antica**. The highlights of this well-preserved town include the Baths of Neptune, Agrippa's Theatre, the Forum, the Temple of Rome and Augustus, the Temple of Rome Victorious, the *Piazzale delle Corporazioni* (square of the merchants guilds), the Grandi Horrea (warehouses), the Domus of Fortuna Annonaria, and the Casa di Diana. The Museum of Ostia also houses statues, mosaics, and frescoes found at the site. If time permits, we will visit the Parco Cafarella outside Rome to see the wonderful remains of Roman Aqueducts. On our return to Rome this evening's talk will look at *Death and Glory in Ancient Rome*. (B)

SUNDAY 13TH JANUARY

Back in Rome, we begin our morning with a walk to the **Colosseum**. Having gazed on its ruins, we spend the rest of the day strolling along the famous **Via Appia**. The sites visited along this road include the **Circus of Maxentius**, the tombs of elite Romans (like Caecilia Metella), and some of Rome's earliest catacombs. Today you may wish to have lunch at the *Osteria Antica* (located in a *columbarium*, perhaps that of Augustus' freedmen) or to take a picnic lunch. (B)

MONDAY 14TH JANUARY

Free Day (B)

TUESDAY 15TH JANUARY

If it can be arranged, we will begin the day by climbing Trajan's Column. We will then make our way to the extensive and entertaining collection of inscriptions housed in the **Terme Diocleziano Museo Epigraphico**. After lunch we will visit the **Museo Palazzo Massimo**, a wonderful collection of statues and frescoes from Livia's Villa at Prima Porta. Returning to the hotel there will be a lecture on *Maxentius and Constantine: (Re)Shaping Rome*. (B)

The altar was moved to a new location by the dictator Mussolini and has recently re-opened, housed in a controversially modern structure.

TOUR LECTURES

Evening lectures are an integral part of the Summer School program. The lectures will survey the history, culture, art, architecture, and literature of Rome and are organised to provide information before visiting each site on the itinerary. Some introductory lectures will be delivered on-line prior to departure.

WEDNESDAY 16TH JANUARY

Sacred space has always played an important role in the City of Rome. Today we will visit the site of **Temple of Claudius** before walking to the church of **San Stefano**. After a leisurely lunch we will visit **San Giovanni in Laterano** and the **Lateran Baptistery** before returning to the Hotel. This evening there will be a lecture on *Rome and the Roman Campagna*. (B)

THURSDAY 17TH JANUARY

After a quick stop at **Santa Costanza**, the magnificent shrine to Constantine's daughter, we will make our way to **Palestrina**, the site of ancient Praeneste. We will visit the ancient forum and the **Museo Archeologico Nazionale Prenestino**, located at the top of a series of magnificent terraces which were originally part of the temple of Fortuna Primigenia. From the museum-temple we will visit the picturesque town of **Nemi** to enjoy an extended lunch and a walk around this beautiful lakeside town. In ancient times, this lake was the site of an important Sanctuary of Diana. Later it served as the setting for the emperor Caligula's pleasure-cruises. On returning to the hotel there will be a talk on *The Vatican Museum Collections*. (B, L)

FRIDAY 18TH JANUARY

An early start to make the most of the **Vatican Museums**. After beating the crowds to the Sistine Chapel we will take you to the Museo Gregorio Profano to see one of the best collections of Roman sculpture. From here you will be free to explore the rest of the extensive collections of the Vatican Museum and have lunch in the museum's café. From the Vatican we will make our way to the church of **St Peters** with the option, for those who are interested, to climb the dome. On returning to the hotel there will be an evening talk on *Slotting in the Popes: Damasus and Early Christian Rome*. (B)

SATURDAY 19TH JANUARY

Prepare to be taken on a walking tour of five of Rome's beautiful and interesting churches. The walk takes in SS. Cecilia, Prassede, Quattro Coronati, Maria Maggiore, and Clemente. This evening's talk looks at: *Renaissance and Baroque Interpretations of Classical Rome*. (B)

SUNDAY 20TH JANUARY

Our final walking tour in Rome, today's stroll takes in the Classical Baroque City. The highlights of this day include the **Trevi** fountain, San Andrea Quirinale, Carlino, **Via Sistina** and Spanish Steps. After Lunch we walk through the Borghese Gardens to visit the exquisite **Borghese Gallery**. On returning to the hotel it will be time to get ready for our special 'Farewell to Rome' dinner. (B, D)

MONDAY 21ST JANUARY

Your flight on *Thai Airways* departs from Rome Airport, at 2.15pm. We will transfer to the airport at about 11.00am. The flight arrives in at 8.00pm on Tuesday 22 January (Melbourne and Brisbane arrivals also possible).

EXTENSION TRIP TO THE VESUVIUS REGION 21ST – 28TH JANUARY

Departing Rome early, the tour makes its way south to the picturesque town of *Vico Equense*. From this base, we will spend the next five days exploring the ancient cities that once lived in the shadow of Vesuvius. The itinerary includes:

- The National Archaeological Museum at Naples
- Pompeii
- Herculaneum
- Cumae and Baiae
- Free time to visit the Amalfi Coast and the Island of Capri

The exact timing of site visits on the extension trip has been kept open to make the most of the weather.

The extension trip includes

- all accommodation and breakfasts
- travel from Rome to Vico Equense and from Vico Equense to Rome Airport
- three meals at restaurants in Vico Equense
- all entrances to sites and local guides where required
- background talks on sites

Your return flight on *Thai Airways* departs from Rome Airport, at 2.15pm on Sunday 27 January. Flights return to Sydney at 8.00pm on Monday 28 January. (Returns to Melbourne and Brisbane can also be arranged.)

WHO MAY COME ON THIS TOUR?

WEATHER ON TOUR

January is a great time for 'cultural travel' to Rome. There are few tourists and religious pilgrims around, with very few queues for major monuments. Temperatures are cool in the morning (around 3-6 degrees), usually warming up to 12-15 degrees in the day. Rainfall is not heavy – it is reasonable to expect light rain on 3-4 days only.

ADDITIONAL TRAVEL AND STOPOVERS

We are more than happy to arrange additional travel either before or after the tour dates. Stopovers on the outbound or return flight are also possible for those wishing to break their journey. Please note that there may be additional charges for varying your travel. Please contact us on (02) 9235 0023 to discuss your requirements.

TAXES & SURCHARGES

The tour price does not include taxes and fuel surcharges. These will be calculated at the time the final invoice is issued. Taxes may vary according to the route and any stopovers made. With the current instability in world oil prices, fuel surcharges are also subject to change. On 01 April 2007 taxes and surcharges for return travel to Europe via Bangkok were approximately \$450.

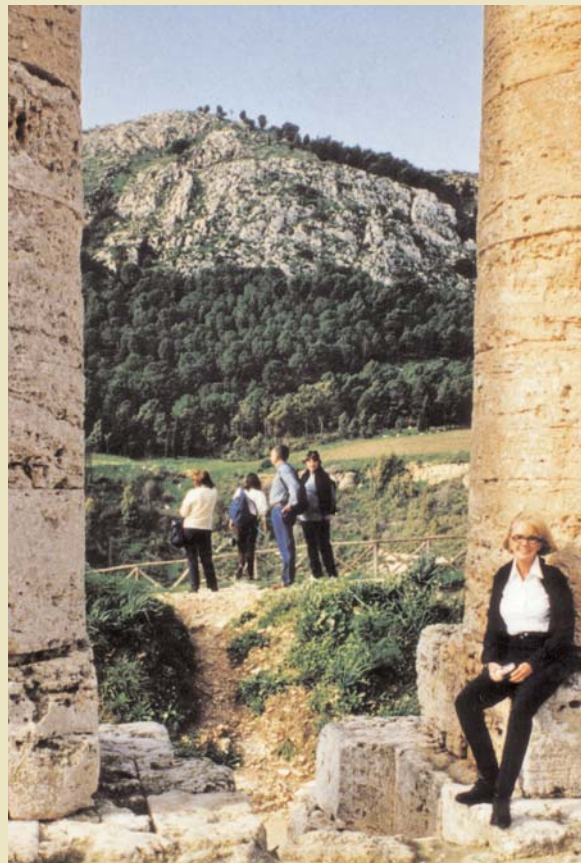

WILL THE TOUR PRICE CHANGE?
