Foreword from the Vice-Chancellor & CEO;

The 2018 ASEAN Virtual Business Plan competition reinforces the University of New England's (UNE) core value of helping people and communities adapt to a rapidly changing world. It portrays our teaching excellence, strength in online teaching, digital dominance and student diversity, especially in relation to Small Business and Entrepreneurship Education.

Small Business and Entrepreneurship Education in Australia started at UNE in the mid-1980s, championed by the late Professor Geoffrey Meredith who pioneered research in the field with the first Australian journal of Small Business. He also developed industry averages to assist performance management in SMEs which are still relevant today. Associate Professor Kotey and her colleagues in the UNE Business School have continued this legacy, with research and teaching innovations recognised at national and international levels. UNE has an active graduate research program in SME operations and development at Master and Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) levels. The PhD Innovation program enables students to explore, analyse and document policies and programs that support SME development. In addition, UNE's Smart Region Incubator, established in 2017, supports business start-ups in the region.

The 2018 ASEAN Virtual Business Plan Competition is one of the teaching innovations aimed at using virtual technology to support Entrepreneurship Education, exchange of ideas and culture, and trade development across countries. I congratulate Associate Professor Kotey and the Australian, Malaysian and Thailand leaders and teams for successfully completing the national competitions. Finally, I thank the Australia-ASEAN Council and all sponsors for supporting the project.

Foreword from Associate Professor Bernice Kotey;

The UNE Business School is pleased to host the 2018 ASEAN Virtual Business Plan competition. The competition is supported by the Australian Government through the Australia-ASEAN Council (AAC) of the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade. It involves the University of New England in Australia, Rangsit University in Thailand, and the Universiti Teknologi MARA (UiTM) in Malaysia. Each university has successfully organised a national competition and the two top teams from each country will pitch their ideas to a panel of international judges at this event.

In Australia, 48 Expressions of Interest (EOIs) were received from 9 universities. Eighty teams comprising 232 individuals from 6 countries (Bangladesh, Bhutan, Cambodia, China, Vietnam and Thailand) provided EOIs for the Thailand competition. There were 136 EOIs from 32 universities in Malaysia.

Rangsit University organised two training sessions, the first to introduce participants to the competition and the second to teach them to write business plans and pitch their ideas, culminating in the national competition on 7 May 2018. UiTM held pre-pitching training for 144 participants and the national competition occurred on 10 May 2018.

In Australia, preparation for the competition occurred virtually with participants spread across the country, from Queensland, NSW and Victoria to Tasmania and Western Australia. We developed resources to support all stages of the competition. A webinar was held and participants were provided one-on-one mentoring on their business plans via telephone and email. The results of the national competition were announced on 18 June 2018.

I thank the Thailand and Malaysian project leaders and their teams, the Vice Chancellor of UNE, and all staff who provided support for the project.

Bernice Kotey

is Associate Professor of Small Business, Entrepreneurship and Accounting at the UNE Business School and a CPA (Australia). She has published extensively in the areas of Accounting, Human Resource Development, Innovation and Gender as they apply to Small Business, as well as on Regional Development issues. Her research supervisions cover Entrepreneurship in a number of countries including South Africa, Ghana, China, Thailand and Vietnam. Her teaching innovations have led to international, national and university awards.

Prof Normah's research interests are in the areas of corporate integrity, governance and financial criminology. She is currently the Deputy Chairman and founding member of the Asia-Pacific Management Accounting Association (APMAA) based in Japan. She served on the national-level operation review panel of the Malaysian Anti-Corruption Commission (MACC). Normah has successfully supervised several research Masters and Doctor of Philosophy students to completion and has published over 80 research articles and book chapters.
