School of Law Take-Home Examinations Policy (v3, adopted SEC 18.08.21)

- Take-home examinations, as for supervised and invigilated examinations, must be reviewed for quality assurance purposes by an appropriately academically qualified 'reviewer'.
- 2. Take-home examinations are not approved assessments for core LLB units.¹
- 3. Most supervised examinations are two and a quarter hours. Under the UNE *Assessment Guidelines,* the maximum length of an examination is three hours working time.² A take-home examination should conform to those requirements. Accordingly, take-home examinations should be designed to be completed to passing standard by an appropriately academically prepared student within two to three hours working time.
- 4. A two-hour examination is equivalent to 2000 words.³ The maximum word length permitted for a take-home examination is 3000 words (excluding footnoted references and a reference list if any).
- 5. The submission window is the time between the release of the take-home examination questions and the latest time for submission of answers. The maximum submission window is 48 hours after the release of the examination questions.
- 6. The due date of a take-home examination cannot be later than the final day of the UNE examination period. The selection of the due date should ensure that marking and results will be ready in time for results return for the School of Law Board of Examiners' processes.
- 7. The following information about the take-home examination must be published in the Assessment tile of the Moodle site at least one week prior to the commencement of the trimester.⁴
 - Due date and time,
 - Submission window,
 - Weighting,
 - Submission process,
 - Details of any required referencing style, and
 - A statement explaining that extensions are not available for takehome examinations.
- 8. Assessment (marking) criteria for the take-home examination (as with all assessments) must be published in the Unit Outline or on the Unit's Moodle site.⁵
- 9. Extensions are not available for take-home examinations. In the event of an unforeseen and unavoidable adverse event affecting exam performance, students may apply for a Special Examination, Special Consideration or Withdrawal without Academic Penalty.
